#### LICENSING OBJECTIVES

- Operate the premises in a responsible manner with staff fully trained in age verification, responsible alcohol service, and incident management.
- Maintain clear operating procedures covering security, safety, and customer care.
- Keep accurate records including training logs, incident logs, refusals logs, and maintenance checks.
- Engage proactively with local authorities, neighbours, and responsible authorities to address any concerns promptly.
- Ensure the premises is clean, well lit, well supervised, and managed by competent staff at all times.

## b) The prevention of crime and disorder

- Implement a Challenge 25 policy and keep a refusals register.
- Ensure CCTV covers all public areas, with recordings retained for a minimum period and available to police on request.
- Employ sufficient staff to supervise the premises, especially at busy times.
- Use clear signage to promote responsible behaviour and zero tolerance of violence, drugs, and anti-social behaviour.
- Immediately report serious incidents to police and keep an incident log.

## c) Public safety

- Conduct regular risk assessments for fire, crowd management, equipment, and general safety.
- Maintain fire safety systems, emergency lighting, and clearly marked exits.
- Ensure all staff are trained in emergency procedures and first aid arrangements.
- Keep walkways unobstructed and maintain the premises in good repair.
- Manage capacity to ensure the premises never becomes overcrowded.

## d) The prevention of public nuisance

- Control noise from amplified sound, customers, and equipment, including keeping doors and windows closed when needed.
- Use signage and staff supervision to encourage customers to leave quietly and respect neighbours.
- Manage deliveries, waste collections, and bottle disposal to avoid noise at sensitive times.
- Prevent loitering outside the premises and manage any external areas responsibly.
- Regularly review operations to minimise any impact on nearby residents.

- e) The protection of children from harm
- Operate Challenge 25 at all times with approved ID only.
- Ensure children are supervised and not allowed in areas where their presence would be inappropriate.
- Train staff to recognise signs of vulnerability and safeguard under-18s.
- Prevent access by children to age-restricted entertainment or products.
- Keep a refusals log and review it regularly as part of staff training.

#### Section 17 of 18

#### NOTES ON REGULATED ENTERTAINMENT

In terms of specific **regulated entertainments** please note that:

- Plays: no licence is required for performances between 08:00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
- Films: no licence is required for 'not-for-profit' film exhibition held in community premises between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day provided that the audience does not exceed 500 and the organiser (a) gets consent to the screening from a person who is responsible for the premises; and (b) ensures that each such screening abides by age classification ratings.
- Indoor sporting events: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000.
- Boxing or Wrestling Entertainment: no licence is required for a contest, exhibition or display of Greco-Roman
  wrestling, or freestyle wrestling between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not
  exceed 1000. Combined fighting sports defined as a contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or
  wrestling with one or more martial arts are licensable as a boxing or wrestling entertainment rather than an
  indoor sporting event.
- Live music: no licence permission is required for:
  - o a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.
  - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
  - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
  - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
  - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
- Recorded Music: no licence permission is required for:
  - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
  - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
  - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school proprietor or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.

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- Dance: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the
  audience does not exceed 500. However, a performance which amounts to adult entertainment remains
  licensable.
- Cross activity exemptions: no licence is required between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, with no limit on audience size for:
  - o any entertainment taking place on the premises of the local authority where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the local authority;
  - o any entertainment taking place on the hospital premises of the health care provider where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the health care provider;
  - o any entertainment taking place on the premises of the school where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the school proprietor; and
  - o any entertainment (excluding films and a boxing or wrestling entertainment) taking place at a travelling circus, provided that (a) it takes place within a moveable structure that accommodates the audience, and (b) that the travelling circus has not been located on the same site for more than 28 consecutive days.
